
SAGUARO CACTUS WASH CLOTH



MATERIALS

- US 6/4.25 mm knitting needles.
- 1 skein of Hobby Lobby's I Love This Cotton! Yarn, or preferred cotton yarn. You will need approximately 75 yards of worsted-weight cotton yarn.
- Scissors.
- Tapestry needle for weaving in ends.

APPROXIMATE FINISHED DIMENTIONS

7.25" wide x 7" tall

TERMINOLOGY

-This pattern uses standard US knitting terms-

- CO = Cast On
- K = Knit
- P = Purl
- St = Stitch
- Sts = Stitches
- RS = Right Side
- WS = Wrong Side

NOTES

*The cactus design is created by alternating knit and purl stitches.

*Pattern is worked back and forth, so be sure to pay attention to your RS (Right Side) and WS (wrong side) rows.

*Right Side (RS): all blank squares of graph design are **purled**, and all filled-in squares are **knitted**.

*Wrong Side (WS): all filled-in squares of graph design are **knitted**, and all blank squares are **purled**.

*You will ALWAYS **knit** the first 4 stitches AND last 4 stitches of every row at the beginning and end of your graph design.

*Photo of completed wash cloth on page 1 shows the “right side”.

NOTES ON SALE AND DISTRIBUTION

WRITTEN PATTERN

START

1. CO 34 sts to your straight (or circular) US 6/4.25 mm knitting needles.

BORDER

2. Knit 8 rows.

DESIGN

3. Follow graph design, and/or continue to written graph instructions below. Remember that 4 knit stitches are to be worked before AND after your graph design to create a border.

WRITTEN GRAPH INSTRUCTIONS

Row 1 (WS): Knit ALL sts.

Row 2 (RS): Knit 4 sts, Purl each stitch except the last 4 sts. Knit remaining 4 sts.

Row 3 (WS): Knit 4 sts. K 9 sts, P 8 sts, K 9 sts. Knit 4 sts.

Row 4 (RS): Knit 4 sts. P 9 sts, K 8 sts, P 9 sts. Knit 4 sts.

Row 5 (WS): Repeat Row 3.

Row 6 (RS): Repeat Row 4.

Row 7 (WS): Repeat Row 3.

Row 8 (RS): Repeat Row 4.

Row 9 (WS): Repeat Row 3.

Row 10 (RS): Repeat Row 4.

Row 11 (WS): Repeat Row 3.

Row 12 (RS): Repeat Row 4.

Row 13 (WS): Repeat Row 3.

Row 14 (RS): Knit 4 sts. P 2 sts, K 22 sts, P 2 sts. Knit 4 sts.

Row 15 (WS): Knit 4 sts. K 2 sts, P 22 sts, K 2 sts. Knit 4 sts.

Row 16 (RS): Repeat Row 14.

Row 17 (WS): Repeat Row 15.

Row 18 (RS): Repeat Row 14.

Row 19 (WS): Knit 4 sts. K 2 sts, P 5 sts, K 2 sts. P 8 sts. K 2 sts, P 5 sts, K 2 sts. Knit 4 sts.

Row 20 (RS): Knit 4 sts. P 2 sts, K 5 sts, P 2 sts. K 8 sts. P 2 sts, K 5 sts, P 2 sts. Knit 4 sts.

Row 21 (WS): Repeat Row 19.

Row 22 (RS): Repeat Row 20.

Row 23 (WS): Repeat Row 19.

Row 24 (RS): Repeat Row 20.

Row 25 (WS): Repeat Row 19.

Row 26 (RS): Knit 4 sts. P 9 sts, K 8 sts, P 9 sts. Knit 4 sts.

Row 27 (WS): Knit 4 sts. K 9 sts, P 8 sts, K 9 sts. Knit 4 sts.

Row 28 (RS): Repeat Row 26.

Row 29 (WS): Repeat Row 27.

Row 30 (RS): Repeat Row 26.

Row 31 (WS): Knit ALL sts.

Row 32 (RS): Knit 4 sts. Purl each stitch except the last 4 sts. Knit remaining 4 sts.

BORDER

4. Knit 8 rows.

FINISHING

5. Loosely bind-off. Cut your yarn, and use your tapestry needle to weave in loose ends.

Hooray! You have completed a Saguaro Cactus Wash Cloth. ☺
