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# SCHOOL DAYS COASTER PACK

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Apple and Pencil Coasters



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These are beginner/easy level patterns. Gauge is not important for either of these projects.

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# PENCIL

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This pattern is worked in standard US terms. My finished pencil measures 7.25” long from eraser to led tip by 3.5” tall.

## Supplies

This pattern is worked in rows. If you are a very new to crocheting a stitch marker may be helpful for keeping track of the first stitch for each row, but it is not necessary for this project.

- ❖ YARN: All for this project is worsted weight.
  - Carron Simply Soft in Sugar Coral

- I Love This Yarn in Gray Mist
- I Love This yarn in Yellow
- I Love This Yarn in Linen
- I Love This Yarn in Black
- ❖ Hook size H/8 (5.00 mm)
- ❖ Scissors
- ❖ Darning Needle

## Stitch Guide

- ❖ Ch-Chain
- ❖ SC-Single Crochet
- ❖ DC-Double Crochet
- ❖ SC2TOG-Decrease by single crocheting

## Instructions

Starting with the Sugar Coral Yarn  
Chain 16

Row 1: Starting with the second chain from the hook 1sc in each chain across (15), ch 1 and turn.

Row 2-3: 1 sc each stitch across (15), ch 1, and turn.

Row 4: 1 sc each stitch across (15), change to the Gray Mist, ch one and turn.

Row 5-8: 1 sc each stitch across (15), ch 1, and turn.

Row 9: 1 sc each stitch across (15), change to the Yellow yarn, ch one and turn.

Row 10-18: 1 sc each stitch across (15), ch 1, and turn.

Row 19: 1 dc in first 3 stitches, 1 sc in the next 2 stitches, 1 dc in the next 5 stitches, 1 sc in the next 2 stitches, 1 dc in next 3 stitches (15), change to the Linen, ch one and turn.

Row 20: 1 sc in the first 3 stitches, 1 dc in the next two stitches, 1 sc in the next 5 stitches, 1 dc in the next 2 stitches, 1 sc in the last 3 stitches (15), ch one and turn.

Row 21: 1 sc in each stitch across (15), ch one and turn.

Row 22: Sc2tog, 1 sc in the next 11 stitches, sc2tog (13), ch 1 and turn.

Row 23: Sc2tog, 1 sc in the next 9 stitches, sc2tog (11), ch 1 and turn.

Row 24: Sc2tog, 1 sc in the next 7 stitches, sc2tog (9), ch 1 and turn.

Row 25: Sc2tog, 1 sc in the next 5 stitches, sc2tog (7), ch 1 and turn.

Row 26: Sc2tog, 1 sc in the next 3 stitches, sc2tog (5), change to the Black yarn, ch 1 and turn.

Row 27: 1 sc each stitch across (5), ch 1 and turn.

Row 28: Sc2tog, sc, sc2tog (3), ch 1 and turn.

Row 29: Sc2tog, sc (2), ch 1 and turn.

Row 30: Sc2tog and finish off.

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# APPLE

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This pattern is worked in standard US terms. My finished apples measure approximately 4” wide by 5” tall (from apple bottom to top tip of the leaves)

## Supplies

This pattern is worked in rows. If you are a very new to crocheting a stitch marker may be helpful for keeping track of the first stitch for each row, but it is not necessary for this project.

- ❖ YARN: All for this project is worsted weight.
  - I Love This Yarn in Green

- I Love This Yarn in Red
- I Love This yarn in Lime Light
- ❖ Hooks
  - For apples Hook I/9 (5.50mm)
  - For leaves Hook G/6 (4.25mm)
- ❖ Scissors
- ❖ Darning Needle

## Stitch Guide

- ❖ Ch-Chain
- ❖ SS-Slip Stitch
- ❖ SC-Single Crochet
- ❖ HDC-Half Double Crochet
- ❖ DC-Double Crochet
- ❖ SC2TOG-Decrease by single crocheting

## Instructions

Red apples are done in the red yarn, and green apples are done in the Lime Light. The green yarn is for the leaves. Apples are worked using the I hook, and leaves are worked using the G hook.

### Apple

Using your Red or Limelight yarn and the I hook.

Chain 14

Row 1: Starting in the second chain from the hook 1 sc, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 stitches, 1 dc in each of the next 2 stitches, sc in next stitch, ss in next stitch, sc in next stitch, 1 dc in each of the next 2 stitches, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 stitches, 1 sc in the final stitch (13), ch 1 do not turn. Proceed with next row.

Row 2: This row is worked in the back loops of your foundation chain. 1 sc in each stitch across (13), ch 1 and turn.

Row 3-5: 1 sc each stitch across (13), ch 1 and turn.

Row 6: 2 sc in first stitch, 1 sc in each of the next 11, 2 sc in last stitch (15), ch 1 and turn.

Row 7-8: 1 sc in each stitch across (15) ch 1 and turn.

Row 9: 2 sc in the first stitch, 1 sc in each of the next 13, 2 sc in the last stitch (17), ch 1 and turn.

Row 10: 1 sc in each stitch across (17), ch 1 and turn.

Row 11: Sc2tog, 1 sc in each of the next 13, sc2tog (15), ch 1 and turn.

Row 12: 1 sc in each stitch across (15), ch 1 and turn.

Row 13: Sc2tog, 1 sc in each of the next 11, sc2tog (13), ch 1 and turn.

Row 14: 1 sc each stitch across (13), ch 1 and turn.

Row 15: Sc2tog, 1 sc in each of the next 9, sc2tog (11), ch 1 and turn.

Row 16: 1 sc in each stitch across (11), ch 1 and turn.

Row 17: 1 sc in first stitch, 1 hdc in next 3 stitches, 1 sc, 1 ss, 1sc, 1hdc in next 3 stitches, 1 sc in last stitch (11) ch 1 but do not turn.

Border: You are now going to do a sc border around the entire apple. Where the stitches are placed for this are not important except for the top and the bottom.

On the sides do one sc around evenly spaced.

On the bottom of the apple make sure you are doing your stitches in the stitches from your Row one so that the apple maintains its bottom shape.

When you get to the top and join to the first stitch of row 17 with a ss and finish off.

## Leaves

Using the Green Yarn and the G hook.

Find your ss from the center of row 17 and anchor your yarn. Chain 8

Row 1: Starting from the 3<sup>rd</sup> chain from your hook join with a ss, (these steps will not be part of your stitch count.) then 1 hdc in each stitch (5), ch 1 and turn.

Row 2: 1 hdc in each stitch, in same stitch as your last hdc join with a ss and finish off.

If you are making 2 leaves per apple repeat these same steps for the second leaf.
